AFFIDAVIT FOR SEARCH WARRANT

- 1.) A search is requested in relationship to an offense substantially described as follows:
Violation of Virginia Code Section 18.2-32 First Degree murder of Kevin Lewis Bryant

- 2.) The place, person, or thing to be searched is described as follows: Single story residence with small front porch centered on the side of the house facing Stafford Street. The residence has gray wooden siding, red painted tin roof and white trim. There is a set of wooden stairs on the south side of the residence that lead to the basement apartment. The basement apartment is the known residence of Nettie Salisbury who is the primary suspect in this case. The apartment door is located on the east side of the residence on the basement level. The apartment door is white with glass panes and has a white storm door. There is no visible numbers marking this residence or apartment however it is identified by city records as 135 Stafford Street.

- 3.) The things or persons to be searched for are described as follows:
Knife- single edged knife with black or brown handle and silver blade
Shirt- white shirt worn by suspect at time of assault
Any other clothing or items found that may contain blood from the victim or show the intent to conceal the crime.

- 4.) The material facts constituting probable cause that the search should be made are:
On 09-14-08 around 2124 hours the Staunton Police Department received a 911 call reporting that a male subject had been stabbed and he was laying in the 100 block of Stafford Street. Officers arrived on the scene and found a black male who was later identified as Kevin Lewis Bryant) lying in the street in front of 131 Stafford Street. The victim had a single stab wound in the center of his chest. The victim succumbed to his injury and was pronounced dead at Augusta Medical Center in Fishersville VA. Three juvenile family members witnessed Nettie Salisbury retrieve a knife from within the apartment and then go outside. The victim had exited the apartment just prior to Nettie leaving the apartment with the knife. Nettie Salisbury was seen by several concerned citizens arguing with Kevin Bryant over a pair of shoes just prior to this incident. Nettie was also seen by a concerned citizen lunging at Kevin in a stabbing motion and Kevin subsequently fell to the ground. Nettie was seen by a concerned citizen wearing two different outfits during this time period.

AFFIDAVIT FOR SEARCH WARRANT

- 1.) A search is requested in relationship to an offense substantially described as follows:
Violation of Virginia Code Section 18.2-32 First Degree murder of Kevin Lewis Bryant
- 2.) The place, person, or thing to be searched is described as follows: 135 Stafford Street and its curtilage.

135 Stafford Street is a single story residence with a small front porch centered on the side of the residence facing Stafford Street. The residence has gray wooden siding, red painted tin roof and white trim. There is a set of wooden stairs on the south side of the residence that lead to the basement apartment. The basement apartment is the known residence of Nettie Salisbury who is the primary suspect in this case. The apartment door is located on the east side of the residence on the basement level. The apartment door is white with glass panes and has a white storm door. There are no visible numbers marking this residence or apartment however it is identified by city records as 135 Stafford Street.

- 3.) The things or persons to be searched for are described as follows:
Knife- single edged knife with black or brown handle and silver blade
Any other items found that may contain blood from the victim or show the intent to conceal the crime.

- 4.) The material facts constituting probable cause that the search should be made are:

Three juvenile family members witnessed Nettie Lee Salisbury retrieve a knife from within the apartment and then go outside. The victim had exited the apartment just prior to Nettie leaving the apartment with the knife. Nettie Salisbury was seen by several concerned citizens arguing with Kevin Bryant over a pair of shoes just prior to this incident. Nettie was also seen by a second concerned citizen lunging at Kevin in a stabbing motion and Kevin subsequently fell to the ground. The weapon that was used was reported to be a kitchen style knife with a black or brown handle and a silver blade.

On 09-15-08 Nettie Salisbury was heard saying "go look under that tree and see if you can find the knife." The tree that was being referred to is in the back yard of 135 Stafford Street on the east side of the residence. (This information was received from a witness during sworn testimony in a Special Grand Jury on 09-25-08)

- 5.) The object, thing, or person searched for constitutes evidence of the commission of such offense.
